Wireless pioneer and inventor To Keynote Radio Club of America  
Annual Awards Banquet

LITTLETON, CO - October 1, 2010 - Martin Cooper, chairman and co-founder of DYNA, LLC, exec chair and co-founder of ArrayComm, LLC, co-founder and director of GreatCall, Inc, and innovator of Jitterbug, will keynote the 101<sup>st</sup> Annual Awards Banquet of the Radio Club of America, set for Friday, Nov. 19, 2010, at the Park Central Hotel in New York City.

The annual banquet celebration is a one-day event. The cocktail party will begin at 5:30 p.m. followed by dinner at 6:30 p.m.

Martin Cooper (born December 26, 1928 in Chicago, Illinois, USA) is widely recognized as a pioneer and inventor in the personal and wireless telecommunications industry. He led the team at Motorola in the 1970's that developed the first handheld mobile phone. Cooper's experience includes: co-founder and chairman of GreatCall, founder and executive chairman of ArrayCom (a company that works on researching smart antenna technology and improving wireless networks), co-founder of Cellular Business Systems and various management and engineering positions during a 29 year career at Motorola

Cooper gave his name to Cooper's Law, the observation that the number of radio frequency conversations which can be conducted in a given spectrum has doubled every 30 months since Marconi's spark gap transmitter.

In 1995, Cooper received the Wharton Infosys Business Transformation Award for his technological innovations in the communications field. Cooper is a member of Mensa and was mentioned in Red Herring's top ten entrepreneurs of 2000. In 2009, along with Raymond Tomlinson, Cooper received the Prince of Asturias Award for scientific and technical research. In February of this year he was elected to the National Academy of Engineering. Cooper has been interviewed on CBS 60 minutes, the Cable News Network (CNN), and National Public Radio (NPR). He is a Radio Club of America (RCA) member and has received the prestigious Fred Link Award.
